The IMSA WeatherTech Sportscar Championship has ended for the 2018 season along with all other major racing series. Don't worry Corvette racing fans the 2019 season gets underway in January with the 24 Hours of Daytona. However, despite the great 2018 performance of the Corvette racing team there are concerns on the horizon.

One concern for the 2019 season is the Corvettes' performance. The car that will open the 2019 season at Daytona is the same car that closed out the 2018 season. The Corvettes struggled for wins during last season and I believe that will continue during the first part of 2019. There will be some minor changes to the car for the first part of 2019, there always are but, I do not believe any major performance gains will be made until the mid-engine car appears at LeMans, France in June.

The second concern for 2019 is Chevrolet recent move away for passenger cars. Americans have been moving away from sedans and coupes into trucks and SUVs. Chevrolet will continue to sell Corvettes and Camaros but you have to wonder how long this will continue. The market of enthusiast continues to dwindle and you know the GM bean counters will be looking at the return on investment. A case can be made for what the notoriety and engineering knowledge gained from racing (think about Porches reputation gained from racing) can do for a company. However, dollars are what matter in business and quantifying gains from racing can be difficult. Keep your fingers crossed or better yet. let Chevrolet/GM know you want the Corvette to continue.

Corvettes race in other racing series besides IMSA for example the Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) Trans Am series. Next year in addition to IMSA I will try and gave some information on these other racing series and how our beloved Corvettes are doing.

Track Day at Dominion Raceway, Thornburg, VA By Dave Jones

The Battlefield Corvette Club invited the ACCC to join them on November 10 at Dominion Raceway in Thornburg, Virginia, for a day of fun and excitement. They arranged track time for club members, and passengers, to enjoy. Representing ACCC were Steve Argubright, in his C7, and the writer, in his C4, on what was a beautiful Fall day, with blue sky and cool temperatures, a perfect day for racing. A total of 9 Corvettes, some with passengers, met at the raceway at 9:45. After signing the necessary waiver, a tour of the facility was provided followed by a safety brief.

At 11:30 we took the track for 10 laps of excitement. The 2-mile road course is a minimum of 36' in width with 12 turns, some of which are banked. There is a 70' difference in elevation on the course and the straight stretch is 2700' in length ending in a challenging sharp left turn.

The event was a "Paced" event, meaning all participants would follow a pace car, which was a Mazda Miata, with no passing allowed. The first lap was a "get acquainted" lap to allow us to get familiar with the track, with the speed increasing with each successive lap. I am not sure about Steve but the fastest speed I attained on the straight stretch was 85 mph. While this seemed to be quite fast we heard that the course can accommodate speeds in the 140-150 mph range. After the event a lunch was provided in the Highway 118 Bar. The cost of the event was \$10, which was to cover the lunch. The best \$10 I have spent in a long time.

This was a great event that tested not only the Corvettes that we own but also the skill of the drivers. A big thanks to BCC and especially Roger Howell for arranging the event and leading us through the morning. Roger indicated that he may schedule a similar event in the spring and I would recommend it for those who would like to have some fun and experience first hand a real road course to find out what your Corvette can do.

Every Child Deserves a Little Christmas





EDITOR'S NOSTALGIA - 1973 Corvette

This was the last year Corvette had chrome bumpers and this time it was only the rear bumper. The previous chrome front bumper was abandoned in favor of a body-color front end collision system that met federal 5mph impact requirements for damage to headlights and safety equip-



ment. Unfortunately, the new package added 35 pounds of weight to the car.

The hood was extended rearward to cover over the windshield wipers, eliminating the failure-prone vacuum-operated lift panels that were used between 1968 and 1972 to conceal the wiper mechanisms. Metal side impact beams were incorporated inside the doors, again per federal mandate.

A new coolant recovery system provided a reservoir to hold high-temperature coolant overflow and return it to the radiator once it cooled. New chassis mounts and rubber inserts inside metal sleeves better isolated passengers from road chatter; a sound-absorbing pad was added to the hood's interior surface, and sound-absorbing material was sprayed on several inner panels to deaden sound. Since the rear window was no longer removable, luggage space increased by two inches because of the removal of the window's storage shelf. And for the first time, radial tires were standard equipment.

Sales again climbed to over 30,000 units and five times more coupes were manufactured than convertibles.


