NEWS FROM THE NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM (NCM) February 2023 Dave Jones

A historic month for Corvette. On January 17, 1953 at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City at the opening of Motorama, GM unveiled the new American alternative to European sports cars, the Corvette, named after small nimble warships. Approximately 50,000 people visited the show that opening day in New York with a total of 1.4 million viewing the display as the show traveled to major cities around the country. Based on the enthusiastic response from the public and the press, GM expedited the production schedule. Bear in mind that this was a fiberglass concept car, not a production-ready version. With typical American ingenuity, resourcefulness, tenacity and a sense of purpose, a plant in Flint, Michigan was retrofitted. A production-ready design was finalized utilizing components from other GM vehicles, including a modified 6-cylinder engine, two-speed power glide transmission, and various other braking and suspension systems. A workforce and supply chain were organized so production could begin by June 30, 1953. Three hundred of these cars rolled out of Flint between June 30 and Christmas Eve, 1953. This year, seventy years later in 2023, we are enjoying the 8th generation of the Corvette, America's Sports Car.

For those into trivia I offer the following from 1953:

One pound of hot dogs - \$0.19	Pie Crust - \$0.33
World Series Tickets - \$7.00	Bicycle - \$39.99
Drive-in Movie, per carload - \$1.00	Lawn Mower, 17.5" - \$84.95

For those who enjoy history, some 1953 events include:

January 1 - Hank Williams dies.

February 28 - James Watson and Francis Crick discover the double-helix structure of DNA.

April 13 - Ian Fleming publishes "Casino Royale," the first James Bond novel.

May 18 - Jackie Cochran is first woman to break the sound barrier, in a F-86 Sabre.

June 2 - Queen Elizabeth II is coronated.

June 30 - First production Corvette is built in Flint, Michigan.

August 12 - USSR tests its first hydrogen bomb.

December - First Playboy published, featuring Marilyn Monroe on the cover.

From the NCM, plant tours are resuming. Bowling Green Corvette plant tours were halted 5 years ago but are returning. Tours must be booked in advance and can now be booked through the end of March 2023. The Museum will be conducting tours on January 16th and one can see all stages of production, however, assembly operations will not be running. Tours are limited to 15 people per hour and guests must be at least 13 years of age. Plant tours for non-members are \$50 per person which includes admission to the Museum. NCM members may purchase a plant tour only for up to 2 individuals for \$35 per ticket. Members can reserve their tour in their Members Only Portal of the Museum website. Closed-toe and heel shoes are required and high heels are not permitted. No electronic devices, i.e. cell phones, cameras, tablets are allowed and guests who use a mobility aid, i.e. cane, walker, crutches will not be allowed to take them on the tour. Wheelchairs will be made available to those in need.






